GOOD CLINICAL PRACTICE FOR SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL RESEARCH – ELEARNING COURSE

In September 2016, the NIH issued a Policy on Good Clinical Practice Training for NIH Awardees Involved in NIHfunded Clinical Trials (https://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/notice-files/NOT-OD-16-148.html)). Good Clinical Practice (GCP) is an international ethical and scientific quality standard for designing, conducting, recording and reporting clinical trials. The principles of GCP help assure the safety, integrity, and quality of clinical trials. Investigators and clinical trial staff who are competent in GCP principles will be better able to assure that the rights, safety and well-being of human subjects are protected; that clinical trials are conducted in accordance with approved plans and with rigor and integrity, and that data derived from clinical trials are reliable.

The National Center for Advancing Translational Sciences (NCATS), National Institutes of Health (NIH), through the Clinical and Translational Science Awards (CTSA) Program initiated a project in 2014 to streamline and standardize GCP training for clinical study personnel, in the gresearchers conducting clinical trials. Ample GCP training exists for investigators conducting drug-tool, or biologic-related studies, but it does not address clinical trials using behavioral interventions and socrame inceresearch.


