Saint Louis University and YouGov surveyed 950 likely Missouri voters from July 19 – July 29 about current political issues, the COVID-19 pandemic, and education policy in Missouri. The following pages present results for most survey questions. The margin of error for survey results for the full sample is 4.18%. Margins of error for questions asked to subsamples are listed below. Original data and analyses from the SLU Poll Directors are available at http://www.slu.edu/poll.

Funding and Support

The Saint Louis University PRiME Center provided the majority of funding for the SLU/YouGov Poll. The origins of the SLU/YouGov Poll lie in an internal Big Ideas competition to define university-wide strategic research priorities sponsored by the Saint Louis University Research Institute. The Big Ideas competition provides funding to research initiatives that demonstrate broad faculty engagement, strong leadership and compelling research plans.

Methodology and Weighting

YouGov conducted a benchmarking survey of Missouri likely voters using a census click methodology, which involves sampling in such a way that all starts to a particular survey are representative of the known demographic characteristics of a specific target group. In this case, YouGov sampled so all starts were representative of Missouri registered voters population, as defined by the 2020 Current Population Survey (CPS) November.

The sample of all starts was matched from 1125 respondents to 950 completes and weighted to a population frame on age, gender, race, education. YouGov used propensity score weighting. In the propensity score weighting process, the matched cases and frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity and years of education. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post-stratified according to these deciles.

The weights were then post-stratified on 2016 and 2020 Presidential vote choice, and a four-way stratification of gender, age (4-categories), race (4-categories), and education (4-categories). The weights were then subsetted on completes and re-centered to produce the final weight for the target population.
